The Arizona Department of Education released 2021-22 School Letter Grades this week. The state's 'Accountability System' is designed to empower schools to achieve and increase success for their students by providing districts and schools with feedback on areas of strength and those that may need additional focus and enrichment.

Schools earn a letter grade based on a range of metrics including proficiency and growth in key subject areas, graduation rates, subgroup proficiency improvement, acceleration and readiness measures, and college and career readiness indicators.

The Letter Grades used are as follows:

A = Excellent

B = Highly Performing

C = Performing

D = Minimally Performing

F = Failing
